DIRECTIONS TO THE LOUISVILLE MEDICAL CENTER (LMC)


From North to LMC's North Gateway:

- Take I-65 South to Exit 136C, Jefferson St. Downtown.
- Stay in left exit lane (Brook St).
- Follow exit ramp onto Brook St.
- Go one block and turn right on Market St.
- Go one block and turn right on Floyd St.
- Go under I-65 overpass.

The North Gateway is located at the intersection of South Floyd St and Muhammad Ali Boulevard.

From South (airport) to LMC's South Gateway:

- Take I-65 North to Exit 136A, Broadway/Chestnut St.
- This exits onto Brook St.
- Go one block.



The South Gateway is located at the intersection of South Brook St. and Broadway.
